A message from the Mayor Cllr. Phil Woodall

t has been an honour and privilege to have served as your Town Mayor for the last year. It has been an amazing opportunity to meet with and learn about so many of the wonderful organisations and charities we are lucky to have within Bognor Regis and has offered a real insight into the extraordinary work they do.

Highlights of the year have included being the first on the ice (and the first to fall over) at the 'ice skating on the Prom' rink which was on the Place St Maur over the Christmas period. A huge success, and one we hope to welcome again in the future. I was also given the opportunity to promote this wonderful seaside Town of ours on various Radio stations, including Radio 2, UK Talk Radio and BBC Sussex.



My charities for this year have been Alzheimer's Society & Epilepsy Action, who I have been raising funds for.







As a Patron of Stonepillow I visited the hostel in Ellasdale Road earlier this year. It is fantastic to see how they are expanding to meet the growing need for important and life changing places such as these.

I was also present at the grand unveiling of the new anti-gravity treadmill for Age UK at the Laburnum Centre in February, which is one of only 150 machines throughout the country, most of which are in closed units, military bases or private hospitals, and not readily available to the wider community, as this one will be.

The treadmill will be used for local people who suffer with cerebral palsy or neurological problems and will do wonders for recovery following knee and hip operations.

I will be holding my 'Scare the Mayor' week from Monday 7th May, during which I shall be challenging myself to step beyond my comfort zone to take on different activities including water walking and going on a zip wire. More information will be published in the local paper nearer the time if you would like to come along to show your support for me and my charities!

To conclude, I would like to offer a positive insight into the regeneration happening in the Town right now.

Many of the empty units in Town are starting to be filled, which is an exciting opportunity to welcome new businesses and promote retail growth in the Town centre. With a new play park along the seafront, a redesigned adventure golf course at Hotham Park, the almost complete expansion of the Picturedrome Cinema, and many more exciting projects such as the developments taking shape at Butlin's, and the University of Chichester's Bognor Campus, things are really starting to look bright for Sunniest Bognor Regis.

There is often confusion as to which Council is responsible for the governance of local services. In Bognor Regis there are three tiers of local government and shown below are their main areas of responsibility.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

ngaging with you, our community, can add real momentum to our projects. Listening to your ideas, issues and concerns allows us to build on our understanding and get better results in what we set out to achieve.

Community engagement has been a real focus for the Town Council this year, with new approaches adopted in how we communicate with those that live and work in our Town.



This broad-based community engagement process has included;

- Extending public question time, at Community Engagement and Environment Committee Meetings held every other month, to allow for in-depth discussions between members of the public, and Councillors, in attendance.
- Introducing Community Engagement Forum sessions, held in the months between scheduled committee meetings, at local schools and community centres.
- Councillor Surgeries held at local venues on a regular basis.
- 'Pop-up' drop-in surgeries allowing members of the public to talk with Councillors about their concerns and issues.

A Youth Worker has been engaged, on a six-month contract, with a remit to reach out to the young people within our community. It is hoped that further funding can be secured to expand the service.

The Council has engaged with young people on collaborative art projects and are currently working on delivering a 'Playing Out' scheme which not only allows children to play safely within the environment in which they live but can encourage other residents to come out and engage, helping tackle loneliness and isolation. What is Twinning all about?

ave you ever wondered what those road signs mean as you approach Bognor Regis - the ones that say 'Welcome to Bognor Regis, twinned with Saint Maur des Fossés, Weil am Rhein and Trebbin'?

Town Twinning was set up after the Second World War to encourage friendly contact between Britain and countries in Europe at a local level. Bognor Regis has been officially partnered with Saint Maur des Fossés, an elegant town on the river Marne, near Paris, and even nearer to Disneyland Europe, since 1980. In 1987 we linked with the town of Weil am Rhein, situated in the southwest corner of Germany, where Switzerland, France and Germany join, and in 1994 we officially twinned with Trebbin, a small town south of Berlin, in the former German Democratic Republic.

hese relationships are not just something written on a sign, or filed in official documents at the Town Hall; they are true bonds of friendship stretching across the Channel encouraging an understanding of each other's culture and history. Bognor Regis Twinning Association, a small but active voluntary organisation, welcomes about 50 visitors from our two German twin towns every 3 years. By supporting with a grant this year, Bognor Regis Town Council made it possible for the Twinning Association to continue their student programme, whereby free places are offered on these trips to two or three young people. An affiliated group runs an exchange to our French twin town every two years, with a return visit in the interim year. From time to time the Twinning Association also runs sporting, rambling and musical exchanges.

The Twinning Association hold social events to not only raise much-needed funds, but also provide great opportunities for members to meet together and have a good time. The most successful annual event is the Beaujolais Bistro, a French style luncheon when the season's Beaujolais Nouveau is sampled along with a tasty meal.
