Residents and communities in Arun are being asked to share their views on crime, community safety and the ongoing plans to tackle persistent anti-social behaviour. The PSPO public consultation survey

The second survey is asking residents, businesses, and visitors for their views on the Council's anti-social behaviour related Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO).

Local authorities can implement a PSPO to combat persistent anti-social behaviour and activities in areas where it's having a detrimental effect on the local community. Restrictions imposed by a PSPO apply to everyone who uses the relevant area and so must be fair and proportionate to the level of nuisance being caused.

This Restart a Heart Day, Thursday 16 October, Kent Surrey and Sussex Air Ambulance Charity are aiming to train tens of thousands of people across the South East in the lifesaving skills of CPR and how to use a defibrillator.
