Residents and communities in Arun are being asked to share their views on crime, community safety and the ongoing plans to tackle persistent anti-social behaviour. The more residents that complete these surveys, the better the oversight Arun District Council will have to understand what's working and what needs improvement.

A local response to local concerns

The Safer Arun Partnership community safety survey is keen to understand more about the issues that most affect residents. As the partnership is currently reviewing its strategic plan, it's a critical time for the voices of residents to be heard so a robust plan can be put in place.

The PSPO public consultation survey

The second survey is asking residents, businesses, and visitors for their views on the Council's anti-social behaviour related Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO).

Local authorities can implement a PSPO to combat persistent anti-social behaviour and activities in areas where it's having a detrimental effect on the local community. Restrictions imposed by a PSPO apply to everyone who uses the relevant area and so must be fair and proportionate to the level of nuisance being caused.

This Restart a Heart Day, Thursday 16 October, Kent Surrey and Sussex Air Ambulance Charity are aiming to train tens of thousands of people across the South East in the lifesaving skills of CPR and how to use a defibrillator.

80,000 people took part last year and now they're going even bigger and better. These lifesaving skills are important to learn because every day across the South East around 25 people experience a sudden out-of-hospital cardiac arrest. Sadly, only about 1 in 10 people currently survive.
