The Meeting opened at 4.05pm

1. <u>TO NOTE THE APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRMAN AND VICE-</u> <u>CHAIRMAN AS AGREED AT THE ANNUAL TOWN COUNCIL</u> <u>MEETING HELD 4th MAY 2021</u>

It was noted that Cllr. Mrs. J. Warr was elected Chairman and Cllr. Barrett was elected Vice-Chairman of this Committee at the Annual Town Council Meeting held on 4th May 2021.

At the Planning and Licensing Committee Meeting, held 31st August 2021, Members were advised that the West Sussex Transport Plan (WSTP) is being reviewed to update the County Council's strategic approach to investment in, and management of, the transport network. They are consulting on this draft version of the <u>Plan</u> to get feedback on its content and the strategies that it sets out. Subject to the consultation feedback it is expected that the plan will be adopted in early 2022.

The vision sets out what we want the transport network to look like in 2036. It is intended to be ambitious but achievable if the plan is implemented as intended.

Vision

Our vision is:

"A West Sussex transport network in 2036 that works for communities in the Coastal West Sussex, Gatwick Diamond and Rural West Sussex economic areas by helping to address the spatial economic challenges of the County, level up the coastal economy and provide access to employment and services countywide.

The transport network will be on a pathway to net zero carbon by 2050 through mass electrification, reduced use of fossil-fuels and local living. It will also be safer and more efficient overall with more walking, cycling and use of public or shared transport and less congestion on major routes that connect West Sussex towns with Gatwick Airport, London and nearby cities.

The transport network will connect communities and allow residents to live healthy lifestyles with good access to the West Sussex coast and the protected South Downs, High Weald and Chichester Harbour.

Active travel modes, public or shared transport will be attractive options in built up areas and between towns, and rural communities will have access to the services they need.

Transport impacts such as air pollution, noise and rat-running on adjacent communities and the environment will be minimised to protect a quality of life that reflects the characteristics of the County."

FOR DECISION

Notification has been received that at Arun's Planning Policy Committee Meeting, held on 1st August 2021, it was agreed that early engagement should commence on a draft list of Development Management (DM) policies – where the Council's proposed Local Plan update would initially focus. The context being to ensure that Arun is best placed with respect to national policy and best practice to ensure that its design standards policies are addressing the 'Climate Change Emergency'.

REPORT BY THE CIVIC & OFFICE MANAGER FOR INFORMATION

- 1. WSCC Public Notice that West Sussex County Council will temporarily close to all traffic Linden Road, Bognor Regis (between the junction with Hawthorn Road to Town Cross Avenue), on 17th September 2021 for up to 5 days (It is estimated to be completed on 17th September 2021). The closure is required for the safety of the public and workforce while carriageway repairs are undertaken. The restriction will be in place off-peak only from 09:30 until 15:00. An alternative route will be signed and access for emergency service vehicles and pedestrians will be maintained at all times during the closure.
- 2. WSCC Public Notice that Highfield Road (Orchard Way roundabout), Bognor Regis, will be temporarily closed on 20th September 2021 for up to 5 days (It is estimated to be completed on 22nd September 2021) and is required for the safety of the public and workforce while BT replace a decayed pole. The restriction will be in place day-time only from 09:30 until 16:00. An alternative route will be signed and access for emergency service vehicles and pedestrians will be maintained at all times during the closure.
- WSCC Notification that the following road closures will be in place to allow for carriageway resurfacing. The road closure will be in place from 08:00 until 16:00 and an alternative route for traffic will be signed on site - please note that these works are weather dependant: - Aldwick Road roundabout (13th September); Den Avenue (14th September); Gordon Avenue (15th September).
