beaches in England received the Seaside Award, with 19 winners in the South East, including Bognor Regis East Beach.




DOGS ON BEACHES

Here at Bognor Regis Town Council we like to see our canine friends enjoying the beauty of our beaches as much as we do, however, during the summer (1st May to 30th September) Arun District Council do not permit dogs in certain areas.



As shown on the map, dogs are not allowed on areas of the beach between Park Road and Gloucester Road, and must be kept on leads whilst on the promenades adjacent to



banned beach areas. The beach ban does not apply to registered blind persons, or to deaf or disabled persons with trained assistance dogs. On other beaches dogs can be freely exercised, but they should not cause a nuisance to other beach users or wildlife.

I am really looking forward to representing Bognor Regis as its Mayor for this year, a place I have called my hometown since 1970.


I was extremely proud to be asked by Cllr. Pat Dillon to serve as his Deputy and having attended a few events during this course I have had a taster





Remembrance...

Since our last Newsletter was published, Bognor Regis Town Council has worked together with our local community in a number of acts of remembrance.

On the 30th June 1916, at the Battle of Boars Head, 17 officers and 349 men of the Royal Sussex Regiment were killed, 11 of those men came from the Bognor Regis area. The Town Council delivered a project called "Then & Now" to commemorate and honour those 11 brave local men and to try and find out as much as possible by creating a picture of who they were.



Working with local historians, children from two local schools, St Mary's Roman Catholic Primary School and Arundel Church of England Primary School, researched each of the 11 men and put together a collage of work which was displayed at the Town Hall and

then at the local library. Attempts were made to try and find any living relatives of the 11 Bognor men, with some getting in touch to share the information they had. Some of the family members undertook further research at the

Chichester Records Office with the assistance of the local historians. A book was produced as a tribute to all the brave men who fought during the World War One conflict but especially those from the 11th, 12th and 13th Battalions of the Royal Sussex Regiment. Copies of the book, showcasing the collaborative work of the local schools, were given to each of the children involved, the families of the soldiers, and the Bognor Regis Memorial Hospital. The British Library in London holds a copy, as will Bognor Regis Library and Bognor Regis Museum Further copies are available from the Town



On the 100th anniversary, 30th June 2016, two separate commemorative services took place to mark the occasion.

The first took place at the Bognor Regis Memorial Hospital where the WW1 Roll of Honour is housed. The service was presided over by Rev Graham Reeves, the hospital Chaplain and attended by the Town Mayor, Cllr. P Dillon; the Deputy Lord Lieutenant, Mr Roger Turner; and a representative for the Royal Sussex Regiment, Mr Nigel Taggart and all laid commemorative wreaths. Other Town Councillors, the Friends of Bognor Hospital and members of the public also took part.

The second service was held at the Bognor Regis Town Hall War Memorial. This was an opportunity for the schoolchildren who had contributed to the project to take part and two representatives from each school laid commemorative wreaths alongside the Town Mayor and Deputy Lord Lieutenant. The Rev Tim Crooks held a small service and the remaining schoolchildren each laid a wooden cross.







of Hotham park to the public for the benefit of all. The area of 9 hectares (22 acres) had been purchased by the former Bognor **Regis urban District** Council from the executors of the late William Fletcher. William had worked

closely Kew with Gardens and at one period the plantings in his garden were compared with Kew as being an outstanding collection of species. It is reported that the boating lake was his pond where he could be regularly seen standing at the side and feeding bread to his large goldfish.

Most of the shrub and herb layers were destroyed in a hurricane in October 1987, but the remnants of a fine tree collection remain. There are over 100 varieties of tree in Hotham Park and many of them are well over 100 years old. Yew trees, are an important food source, particularly in the autumn,

for both birds and squirrels. If you look under the tree and see Yew pips, squirrels have been feeding, as they discard the toxic



seeds after eating the red fruits. Birds, however, will eat the whole fruit, seed and all, as their digestive systems are able to pass the seeds later with no ill effect.

Holm oaks, heavy with acorns, attract Jays whilst Rooks build their nests high in the tree tops around the park. Other bird sightings include Goldcrest, Green Woodpecker, Song Thrush and



Sparrowhawk. For the past 70 years residents Bognor Regis, and visitors to the area, have been able to enjoy the

beauty of Hotham Park. Whether it's a picnic on a sunny day, a walk with the dog, or a game of mini golf, the park has much to offer. Added to which the numerous events that are hosted at Hotham Park each year of which many are planned for 2017, including Bognor Regis Parkrun (every Saturday morning), Music in the Park (selected Sundays) and regular favourites such as the Country Fair. As we celebrate the 70th anniversary of opening Hotham Park to the public, it truly has kept firmly to the original concept of being for the benefit of all.
