## **BOGNOR REGIS HERITAGE TRAILS**



Bognor Regis Town Council are proud to have been involved with the completion of five Heritage Trails, working in partnership with community groups, through the Bognor Regis Heritage Partnership. The trails came about thanks to a successful heritage lottery bid and were officially launched in June 2019, along with a new website (www.bognorregistrails.co.uk) and a series of FREE booklets (available from the Town Hall, Library, Museum and Regis Centre).

The themed walks include a Richard Hotham trail, a Blue Plaque trail, a Seafront 'Fun Facts' trail and a Town Centre trail. There is also a Discovery trail for children around Hotham Park, which involves finding out about the park's variety of different trees.

Designed for the whole family our trails help you discover the people and places that make Bognor Regis so special, and all within a few hundred metres of the seafront.



## **TOWN FORCE**

Many residents will no doubt have seen the Town Council's Town Force team in their green uniforms around the Town carrying out the planting and watering of the roundabouts and planters. The team is made up of 4 staff members and their main objective is to make the Town an attractive and pleasant place for residents and visitors alike.

The planting is changed seasonally and more recently has been designed to be more pollinator friendly. Therefore, more and more of the plants and flowers that are used provide a valuable resource to the bees and butterflies and contribute to a healthier eco-system in our community.

The planting is supported by sponsorship from local businesses. If you are interested in sponsoring one of our planters, details of availability and quarterly prices are available on the Town Council website or by contacting the Town Force Manager.

The "guys in green" will also be familiar faces if you attend any of the Town Council events as they are always on hand to assist with the setting up and running of the day - and have even been known to dress up for the Book Day in Hotham Park! The Town Council also make Town Force available to assist our local organisers in the fantastic work they do in bringing events to the Town such as the Carnival, 10k run and ROX to name but a few.

## **BLUE PLAQUES**

Amongst the Bognor Regis Heritage Trails offered, you might choose to follow the 'Bognor Regis Blue & Memorial Plaque Trail'. The Trail celebrates people and events that have either lived in or influenced the seaside town of Bognor Regis. The trail is focussed primarily on Blue Plaques, but also includes memorial plaques and stones, unlocking the best of Bognor Regis' rich history.In the past few months 8 Blue Plaques have been unveiled in Bognor Regis.





In addition to the planting, Town Force are trained and qualified to undertake graffiti removal around the Town. In the past, the Town Council was able to provide a "clear all" approach and remove graffiti from wherever it appeared, and this was funded by a grant from West Sussex County Council (WSCC). Unfortunately, due to budget cuts at WSCC this funding was withdrawn in 2019 which has limited where the Town Council can remove this blight on our landscape. However, talks are underway with WSCC regarding arrangements for graffiti removal from highways assets (such as the three local subways) after 31st March 2021 when the current agreement expires.



If you are unfortunate enough to have graffiti on your property (private or commercial) outside of the BID area, Town Force can provide a chargeable service to remove this for you. For all enquiries and quotations please contact the Town Force Manager.

The team also undertake chargeable contract work for individuals, local businesses and our neighbouring parishes and these can range from repairing and maintenance of benches to lamppost maintenance, grounds maintenance and planting. If you have a job that you need help with - you know where you can find them. Maybe you can hire the Town Force team!

# **Climate Change**



Climate Change has been a huge topic of conversation for some time now, with more and more people interested in ways in which they can contribute towards tackling this issue.

On 4th November 2019, Bognor Regis Town Council declared a Climate Emergency. The Climate Change Topic Team, bringing together District and Town Councillors along with interested members of the community, meet regularly to discuss short, medium and long-term goals. The Team can make positive, realistic suggestions which are then recommended to the Town Council's Community Engagement and Environment Committee. The Climate Change Topic Team Meetings are open to members of the public and anyone interested in tackling climate change is welcome to attend. Details about these meetings are shared on the Town Council's social media platforms, such as Facebook and our website. ## WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- 1. Half fill the kettle when making a cup of tea
- 2. Use a glass of water for cleaning teeth rather than leaving the tap running
- 3. Turn off lights in unoccupied rooms
- 4. Switch to a green energy supplier
- 5. Don't throw away recycle wherever possible
- 6. Walk, cycle or take the bus, rather than drive, wherever possible
- 7. When out, take your litter home and recycle
- 8. Don't car idle switch off engine when stationary, such as waiting outside of schools or at railway crossings
- 9. Email don't print
- 10. Use recycling products

## **ALLOTMENTS**

Do you long to grow your own vegetables but only have a small garden or no garden at all? Town Council allotments can be rented at a very reasonable cost. Sizes vary from large to a very manageable small. Some of our plot holders have been there for years and have an immense amount of knowledge they are happy to share. A wide variety of vegetables can be grown and in summer salad straight from the allotment tastes so much nicer. Flowers and fruit can also be grown and some even have grapes growing in green houses on their plots.

An allotment is a big responsibility and commitment in all weathers, but the rewards are great if you put in the time and work. If you are interested in taking on an allotment fill in the application form or the Town Council website, where you will find more information about renting an allotment. Once we have your application form you will go on the waiting list for your own plot. Waiting list is currently approximately 6 months to a year long but waiting times can vary and this timescale can change.
