SUMMARY for JULY 2010

July saw the largely settled, static weather patterns of spring and early summer replaced by a more changeable Atlantic type. This airstream was relatively warm but often cloudy. Whilst the north-western half of the UK saw more rainfall than in recent months, the south-eastern half remained drier than average with many warm days. Much of the Midlands, eastern and southern England were very dry with less than half the normal amount in counties from Cambridgeshire to Sussex.

Bognor Regis was dry and fine throughout the month with temperatures ranging from 18.7 deg. C. to 25.2 deg. C. The recorded average sunshine for the month of July is 23.7 deg. C. The total rainfall for the month of July was just 9.2 mm making it one of the driest on record.

The mean maximum temperature of 21.8 °C was slightly higher than the seasonal average of 20.47°C and the mean minimum of 13.8°C was slightly lower than the average mean temperature of 13.56°C
