The Meeting opened at 6.32pm

27. CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS AND APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

The Chairman welcomed those present and went through the evacuation procedure in the event of a fire. Apologies for absence were received from Cllr. Woodall who was on a Mayoral Engagement, Cllr. Enticott due to family commitments and Cllrs. Dillon and Goodheart who were both working. In the absence of the Vice-Chairman, it was **AGREED** that Cllr. Mrs. Daniells would act in this capacity for this Meeting only.

AGENDA ITEM 12 - TO RECONSIDER THE PERMANENT CLOSURE OF HIGH STREET, BOGNOR REGIS, TO THROUGH TRAFFIC AS REQUESTED BY CLLR. J. COSGROVE

REPORT BY CIVIC & OFFICER

FOR INFORMATION

BACKGROUND

At the Council Meeting held on 6th November 2017 the following Motion was received from Cllr. J. Cosgrove: -

"In order to promote a safer and more vibrant Town Centre and after appropriate consultation with all stakeholders, the Bognor Regis High Street should be permanently closed to ALL traffic (except emergency vehicles) between Sussex Street and York Road. Appropriate arrangements should be agreed for retail deliveries within specified times.

Achieving this permanent closure will create a natural square for a wide variety of year-round events and live performances as well as reducing traffic pollution plus bringing a much safer shopping experience for pedestrians.

The proposed 6-week closure of the Esplanade at the height of the holiday season would be wholly detrimental to the High Street economy and improvements."

Having been proposed and seconded, the Motion stood referred to the Planning and Licensing Committee, in accordance with S.O. 9.5 (Min. 112 refers).

At the Planning and Licensing Meeting held on 14th November 2017 Members deliberated the Motion. Members were mindful of future regeneration plans which may include changes to road layout and, rather than show specific support to one particular road scheme at this time, the Committee **RESOLVED** to invite Cllr. Hitchins, Chairman of ADC's Bognor Regis Regeneration Sub-Committee, and Cllr. Lanzer, WSCC Cabinet Member for Highways and Infrastructure, to a meeting to discuss what options were being considered as part of the regeneration proposals (Min. 114 refers).

Members of the Planning and Licensing Committee met with Cllrs. Hitchins and Lanzer at a pre-meeting briefing, held on 9th January 2018, to which fellow Town Councillors were invited.

Extracts from the notes of the pre-meeting briefing, pertaining to High Street, Bognor Regis, included the following;

 Concerns were expressed over the safety of visually impaired pedestrians crossing the High Street, to/from London Road Precinct. Cllr. Lanzer advised that plans are in place to carry out remedial work (tactile flags/ribbed tiles) to delineate the area. Comment was made that a Pelican crossing should be reinstated

- It was unanimously agreed that the existing road traffic regulations on the High Street are frequently being flouted. It was felt that a lack of police presence meant that the regulations were not being enforced. Additional solutions included improved road signage, explaining the restrictions in place for traffic on the High Street, and better use of Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras. It was also suggested that automatic rising bollards could be installed restricting the flow of traffic during regulated times of the day, however, due to the cost implications of such measures this was not likely to be a viable option. Cllr. Lanzer advised that it was difficult to yet know the true outcome of the current traffic restrictions that are in place on the High Street, as they are not being enforced
- Regarding future traffic flow plans on the High Street, there was mixed opinion as to whether it should be permanently closed, semi-closed, open to one-way traffic only or open to two-way traffic (with speed restrictions). In every case it was agreed that consideration must be given to Traders on the High Street, whereby any such traffic scheme could result in a loss of business for them. Cllr. Lanzer advised that only 50% of businesses on the High Street have rear access. Cllr. Goodheart suggested that the matter of two-way traffic, for example, on the High Street could be brought to an Agenda at WSCC, from BRTC (with the consent of the full Council). Cllr. Lanzer asked whether Members might be agreeable in using the channels of communication available to them Council's JWAAC Representative. via the Town Cllr. Hitchins recommended that BRTC carry out a survey amongst Traders, giving a couple of scenarios such as two-way traffic, to gauge what road schemes they would like to see. Cllr. Gardiner pointed out that any such survey should include different categories of Traders.

At the Planning and Licensing Committee Meeting held on 26th June 2018 Members **AGREED** that this item should be included on the Agenda, for the Planning and Licensing Committee Meeting to be held on 17th July 2018, to enable comment by the Town Council to be considered.

WSCC has established a Strategic Transport Infrastructure Programme (STIP) for the identification, assessment, prioritisation and progression of strategic transport schemes.

Strategic transport schemes are those which are either important at a countywide/'larger than local' level or necessary to support the future development of an area, (it does not include infrastructure that is required to mitigate the sitespecific impact of a development – this will be secured through the planning system – or structural maintenance schemes).

Locally important transport schemes continue to be identified and feed into the prioritisation processes for Community Highway schemes, or the Local Transport Infrastructure Programme (LTIP).

The list of STIP priorities are reviewed periodically to establish a rolling programme of studies to be progressed. Changes to the list can be made during periodic reviews as schemes progress or as new schemes are added as a result of the processes identified in Paragraph 3.2. When a review takes place, stakeholders will be consulted and invited to suggest new priorities.

Stakeholders are invited to identify potential priorities for investment using the proforma available with priorities submitted to WSCC, by email, no later than 20th July 2018.

Members are therefore invited to review the WSCC STIP List of Schemes and submit comments on any identified schemes that should be considered as part of the STIP prioritisation process.
