MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE MUSIC FESTIVAL 2007 COMMITTEE

Wednesday 4th April 2007 at the Town Hall

The meeting opened at 7.01 pm.

97. WELCOME BY THE CHAIRMAN

The Chairman welcomed those present.

98. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies of absence were noted as being received from Cllr. D. Eldridge, Cllr R. Nash, A. Levto and E. Benackova.

The Events Officer explained that in Erika's absence she would be taking the Minutes and asked if all members could keep their comments as brief and succinct as possible.

99. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Members and Officers were reminded to make any declarations of personal and/or prejudicial interests that they may have in relation to items on this Agenda.

Notice should be given at this part of the meeting of any intended declaration. The nature of the interest should then be declared later at the commencement of the item or when the interest becomes apparent.

Cllr. K. Scutt declared a Personal Interest in all matters relating to Bognor Regis Town Football Club.

R. Hildreth declared a Personal Interest in all business related to the ROX organisation.

A. Cunard declared personal interest in all business related to the Alexandra Theatre as Trustee of the Alexandra Theatre.

Mrs S. Ross declared a Personal Interest in all matters related to The Bognor Regis Concert Band.

100. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 7th MARCH 2007, PREVIOUSLY CIRCULATED

The Committee **RESOLVED** to approve the Minutes of the meeting held on 7th March 2007 as a true and correct record of the proceedings and the Chairman signed them.

101. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

There were none.

102. WEEKEND 21st – 22nd JULY 2007 AND ROX ELEMENT

Ron Hildreth reported on planning for the Rox element. The last SAG had been postponed. ROX had submitted a revised Health & Safety Document and had addressed issues raised at the previous SAG meeting. ROX felt that Arun and the Police were quite comfortable with what had been submitted. A new security company had been appointed and fund-raising continued. About 40 or 50 local artists had applied to appear over the weekend. The initial event licence had been submitted and the Licensing Committee was due to meet at the end of May.

The Events Officer reported that she had had a meeting with Nick Jones (The Railway PH) and Mark Ringwood, and the possibility of an outside broadcast from The Railway of Mark's Sunday evening show was being proposed to Spirit FM.

103. PROPOSALS FOR MIDWEEK

A Matrix was circulated showing the activities currently arranged. (Appendix 1). The Events Officer reported that she had applied for two lots of funding from WSCC for the Music Festival and both bids had been successful. One was to stage workshops and it was agreed by the Committee that this should be channelled through the workshops being run over the Rox weekend. The second amount was to support the involvement of the Eastern European community with the Music Festival.

The following points regarding the mid-week programme were made:

- The Hamsters (well-known band) have been booked to play at the Theatre on Thursday 26th - this will be on a % basis.
- The Events Officer is still in negotiation with the local E. European community regarding a band from Lithuania, who had indicated they would like to appear. Costings are currently being worked out.
- It was suggested that something should be organised for the younger children, possibly a Junior disco - the Studio room at the Theatre could be available for this.
- Mark Ringwood had suggested another artist who we may be able to get on a % basis, Ruthie Foster, and the Events Officer is investigating this.

Adam Cunard gave his apologies and left the meeting at 7.20pm

- Final details regarding the contract and costings for the Warsaw Village Band need to be agreed - Events Officer to pursue this with M. Ringwood and A. Cunard. Costs will also include pick up from airport and then dropping at hotel in Swindon.
- The Railway PH will be running an Open Mic session on the Wednesday.
- Comment was made about the issue of VAT being charged on ticket sales and this will also be discussed with M. Ringwood and A. Cunard.
- It was suggested that we might be able to use the Littlehampton Community College Steel band - Events Officer to investigate.
- Some equipment will need to be hired in by the theatre and this is being negotiated.

104. PROPOSALS FOR WEEKEND 28th – 29th JULY

The Events Officer has now booked a Country Music Band for the Sunday night and is currently finalising details with the band.

A photo exhibition has been agreed with Nick Jones, who has a large number of photographs of jazz

performers. This will tie in with the performance by Humphrey Lyttelton on the Saturday night. It was suggested that we should try and dress the town for the week, with flags and bunting. The local shops should be encouraged to take part - Events Officer to follow up.

105. BUDGET & OUTSIDE FUNDING UPDATE

The confidential budget list was circulated. Many of the costings are still estimated at this stage. The Events Officer will try and firm up on the cost of performers and also the likely cost of the advertising so that the Budget figures for the next meeting are more specific.

106. THE MUSIC FESTIVAL SAFETY ADVISORY GROUP REPORT

As reported earlier, the last SAG had been postponed, due to the high number of apologies. The next meeting will be 12 April.

107. THE MARKETING GROUP

A copy of the report is attached to these Minutes as Appendix 2. We are still waiting the updated version of the logo.

108. DATE OF NEXT MEETING

The next meeting would be held at The Town Hall at 7pm on 1st May 2007.
