#### 1. WELCOME BY THE CHAIRMAN

Cllr. Eldridge welcomed those present.

Cllr. Mrs. J. Warr offered apologies and left the meeting – 5.33pm.

As the Councillors present could not make any decisions due to the lack of a quorum, it was **AGREED** to make recommendations where necessary.

There was no public present.

#### 4. GENERAL DISCUSSION

The Events Officer reported that she had met Pip Frederick this morning and everything was in hand.

With regard to the Sandcastle competition judging sheets plus rules had been done and the Events Officer is meeting Shirley Hardy to collect the sponsorship money tomorrow. Cheques to winners would be given out on the day as two Councillors who are authorised to sign the cheques will be present.

As for the Classic Motor Cavalcade, there are 102 cars registered. Any cars that turn up on the day will not be judged, nor they receive a plaque or refreshment. Their details will be

taken for next year. Packs for judges had been done together with A5 brochure listing all participants.

The Events Officer reported that everything was in hand for Teddy Bears' Picnic, History Exhibition and Donkey rides.

There are 19 Craft Fair entrants. That is slightly over the maximum and therefore we have to turn people away.

There had been some timing issues with the mosaic competition. It was not possible to get it advertised in the Observer until this week plus the packs for schools should have been distributed earlier. Consequently there are no entries for design so Kat Hutchinson will produce.

Chichester Video Club will be showing a film with the Miss Bognor Regis Carnival of 1962 at RNH and she is coming along as well.

It was reported that there were no posters or programmes in the Library although both had been delivered there before the half term. The Events Officer then made a display and put some programmes on the counter.

So far 100 tickets have been sold for The Old Time Musical.

Police have offered support from the specials for the weekend.

There might be an issue with car parking especially on Sunday. The Events Officer had contacted the owner of the tennis courts by RNH and is awaiting his response.

The Committee noted no great changes to the budget.

There had been an email from Dave Bran, Amberley Working Museum concerning the £5 entry charge for Classic Motor Cavalcade. Members had already discussed this matter previously and considering there are 102 entrants this year in spite of the charge, it was **AGREED to RECOMMEND** the fee to remain.
