How do I report fly-tipping?

If you see someone fly-tipping or would like to report an area where fly-tipping has taken place, you should make a note of the following.

- The date, time and place of the occurrence
- What the waste looks like and how much there is

- A description of any vehicles involved, including the vehicles registration numbers
- A description of any persons involved in the offence

Contact your local Council to clear fly-tipped rubbish on publicly owned land, including roads and lay-bys.

The changes were decided after considering responses to the public consultation from residents and comments from Parish Councils and District and Borough Councils.

As a result, the opening hours will be changed at all Household Waste Recycling Sites (HWRSs) and some will close for two days a week - all remain open at weekends. There will be a nearby HWRS open on the days that each site is closed. All Mobile HWRSs in the Chichester District will

close except for Selsey and The Witterings (which will each operate on a fortnightly basis). There will also be charges introduced for the disposal of non-household waste as detailed in this leaflet. To support your local council there will be increased enforcement measures to tackle fly-tipping.

WHAT IS CHANGING?

Opening hours

From 1st October 2016 opening hours for all 11 HWRSs will be:

- 10am to 5pm from 1st October to 31st March (Winter)
- 10am to 7pm from 1st April to 30th September (Summer)

Opening days

8 out of the 11 HWRSs will close two consecutive days a week from 1st October 2016. All the HWRSs will be open weekends. There will be no change to opening days at Crawley, Burgess Hill and Westhampnett, which are required to operate Waste Transfer Stations for kerbside collection services and will therefore remain open 7 days a week.

THE INTRODUCTION OF CHARGING

What type of waste will I be charged for?

- Tyres from cars, vans, motorcycles (commercial type tyres will not be accepted, for example, LGV)
- Waste from construction, alteration or repair of your home and garden such as plasterboard, breeze blocks, bricks, rubble, soil*, stones, turf*, ceramic bathroom fittings, tiles.

*Grass cuttings and gardening wastes remain free-of-charge.

What are the charges?

- £4 per tyre or part tyre
- £4 per rubble bag or part bag of chargeable waste; or per item; or per sheet of plasterboard.
- Rubble bags no bigger than 55cm x 85cm (can be bought from DIY stores)
- Items such as a concrete fence post, ceramic bath, cistern, paving slab
- Sheets of plasterboard no bigger than 120cm x 240cm
- All materials must be in a rubble bag, loose loads will not be accepted

For a limited period, one free rubble bag will be available upon request for each resident at Household Waste Recycling Sites.

The disposal of all other household waste and recycling materials will remain free of charge for local residents.

How can I pay?

Payment can only be made by Visa or Mastercard debit and credit cards. Cash and cheques cannot be accepted. Payment will need to be made before you are given access to the chargeable containers.
